The Government operates a scheme called Gift Aid that allows charities to claim the basic rate tax on every pound donated. So if you donated £100 to Mlali Community Trust, it means that you'll actually be giving us at least £125! Giving under Gift Aid means that so much more money can be raised with relatively little effort and no extra cost to yourself. This form provides us with the minimum information required for us to be able to claim Gift Aid on a donation.

Gift Aid applies only to 'gifts'. That means we can't use Gift Aid to boost fundraising totals on activities where people have been charged an entry fee or have entered a competition. This also extends to activities where the donor can't be traced (such as giving to collections).

To ensure that the Gift Aid claim is valid, meaning we can claim the money back, it's vitally important that all the information asked for on the Gift Aid Declaration Form is provided.

Tax claimed by the charity

The charity will reclaim 25p of tax on every £1 you give on or after 6 April 2013.

The Mlali Community Trust was the brain child of Kilines Elizabeth Gwajima and a group of Scottish volunteers, and was set up in 2010 as a way to create an international partnership that would work to support the Queen Elizabeth Academy, a school she set up in her home village of Mlali and





The Queen Elizabeth Academy was established in 2007 by Kilines in response to the need she saw in her home area to address the the impact of the current HIV/AIDS pandemic, which has left so many children without parents to take care of them.

Like other regions in Tanzania, Dodoma has thousands of children living in desperate circumstances. Each year, a number of children die before they reach their fifth birthday due to various reasons including disease and hunger. Some of those who survive often go without basic things such as food, safe drinking water, clothes,



Our work so far...

So far, thanks to the kind donations and hard work of our supporters, the Mlali Community Trust has been able to provide funds for the continuing finishing work on the school building, including the installation of electricity, the painting of the outside of the building, the completion of the toilet blocks and the installation of windows. The school did very well in the 2012 annual exams and its population is growing every day. The current building is not big enough to house all of the children comfortably, so expanding this capacity is one of the next things we are working on with Kilines and the team in Mlali. **In order to achieve this, we need you. Whether you can help financially or by giving your skills to either the work in Scotland or in Tanzania, or by fundraising and awareness building, you're help will make a difference to the lives of some of the worlds most vulnerable children.**
